Daytona Beach Loses Its First Black Mayor

A Champion for Unity and Equality

Yvonne Scarlett-Golden died peacefully at home Tuesday, December 5, 2006

Born in 1926, Mayor Scarlett-Golden was a native of Daytona Beach. In 2003, she became the first African American mayor to be elected in the history of the city of Daytona Beach. Prior to becoming mayor, she served four terms (eight years) as city commissioner of Zone 5 (1995 through 2003).

She attended elementary schools at Campbell and Kaiser Laboratory, respectively, and graduated from Campbell Senior High. She received a Bachelor of Science degree, with honors, from Bethune-Cookman College. Her graduate work was done at Boston University where she received her Master of Education, with membership in Pi Lambda Theta honor society. In 1999, she received an honorary Doctor of Law degree from Bethune-Cookman College.

As an educator for more than 38 years, Scarlett-Golden's teaching career began in the Florida school system where she taught elementary, middle, high school, and junior and senior college levels. She continued her career in the San Francisco Unified School District serving as both teacher and counselor on a high school level and as principal of San Francisco's Alamo Park High School in for 20 years.

Upon retirement, San Francisco Mayor Frank Jordan declared Yvonne Scarlett-Golden Day in San Francisco on May 22, 1992. Congressional and community leaders, academicians, political and community activists, parents and students, acclaimed her as a profound exemplar of academic excellence and principled leadership.

Yvonne Scarlett-Golden rose above the racist climax of Daytona Beach growing up. "Who would have thought when I was a little girl, that I could grow up to be the



mayor of Daytona Beach?" she was fond of saying. Once described as "an island of enlightenment in a sea of bigotry," Daytona Beach was forever reshaped under the leadership of Mayor Scarlett-Golden. Her marks shine on the city's beautification, services to the elderly, the boosting of the city's tourism base, professional city management, and a restored fiscal solvency.

Mayor Scarlett-Golden small frame was not exemplary of the huge fiery passion the burned in her heart to see her city grow and prosper. It was common to see her in the fight on the front line whether the fight was with the media or simply a young man wearing his pants too low in public. Her tenacity was needed to win battles such as cleaning up dilapidated parts of the city, and restoring respect to events like Black College Reunion.

Yvonne Scarlett-Golden was a dedicated and passionate leader with uncompromising honesty and integrity. She will be greatly missed. Her mark of excellence has been stamped on the shores of Daytona Beach as she joins the greats of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune and Jackie Robinson.

Now After 20 Years - How Will You Celebrate Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday?

The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who knew it takes time for attitudes to change, would not have been surprised that nearly two decades were required to make his birthday a legal holiday. If anything, King, whose magnificent dream always had a pragmatic cast, would have been surprised that it has happened at all. Even putting aside King's controversial career and his minority race, the odds against the new holiday were imposing. The arguments opposing it — cost to taxpayers, singling him out over others — have been used for decades to resist creation of any new holiday.

His birthday today is an official holiday, on the third Monday of January since 1986. To place the new date in some perspective, consider: It is the first new holiday since 1948, when Memorial Day was created as a "prayer for peace" day. And it's only the third in over a century (the other is Veterans Day, created as Armistice Day in 1926 to honor those who died in World War I).

King is the only American besides George Washington to have a national holiday designated for his birthday (those of Abraham Lincoln, Thomas Jefferson, Robert E. Lee and others have been celebrated in some states but not nationwide). Internationally, King is one of the few social leaders of any country to be honored with a holiday (Mahatma Gandhi's birthday is observed in India). Such status by a member of a country's racial minority is almost unheard of. Generally, the honor is reserved for military or religious figures.

Given such obstacles, the holiday is a powerful tribute to King's philosophy and stature. "As is usually the case with great figures, particularly controversial ones who are fighting for a philosophy condemned by many, Dr. King was well ahead of his time," says Joseph Lowery, King's contemporary counterpart as president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference in Atlanta. "Even those very much opposed to him during his lifetime have come to see that segregation, injustice and militarism are concerns which must be addressed by modern society."


When President Reagan signed legislation creating the holiday in November 1983, it marked the end of a persistent, highly organized lobbying effort spanning the nation for 15 years. "We worked hard to put together a national effort and make a powerful network," recalls Cedric Hendricks, legislative aide to Rep. John Conyers, Michigan Democrat. It was Conyers who, four days after King was assassinated in Memphis, submitted the first legislation to commemorate his birth-

day. Petitions carrying more than 6 million signatures — said to be the largest petition drive in history — were submitted to Congress in 1970. With help from New York Democratic Rep. Shirley Chisholm, Conyers resubmitted the legislation during each congressional session.

The Southern Christian Leadership Conference, which coordinated the petition campaign, also kept continuous pressure on Congress for the holiday. Mass marches in 1982 for voting rights and 1983 to mark the 20th anniversary of King's dramatic speech in Washington, D.C., also contributed. It took bipartisan support to overcome the opposition of Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., who labeled King a Communist, and President Reagan's lukewarm attitude toward the legislation, Lowery said.

In the final analysis, what may have sealed approval of the holiday was a compromise offered by Rep. Katie Hall, Indiana Democrat who marshalled support in the House for the legislation. Hall, responding to criticism that the holiday would be too close to the Christmas-New Year's week, moved its observance to the third Monday of the month. The notion of a three-day weekend, plus the fact that the third Monday often follows Super Bowl Sunday, helped put the measure over the top, supporters say. Arguments concerning money dominated opposition to the holiday. Costs associated with lost services on the King holiday were estimated at \$18 million for the federal government; at \$7 million to Washington state; at \$1.18 million to Seattle. The estimated total was an astronomical \$8 billion for government and private sector combined.

"Every time we'd bring the bill up in the Legislature, people would say, '\$7 million! Are you kidding?! What about all the people starving in the streets?!'" recalls Washington state Sen. George Fleming, Seattle Democrat, who has led legislative efforts since the early 1970s. Another common argument, Fleming notes, was "why put Dr. King above other famous people?" They didn't think his legacy would stand the test of time." Both arguments, Fleming feels, are used to conceal racist resistance to the holiday.

Second Guessing God

But Lot's wife looked back, and she became a pillar of salt. – Genesis 19:26.

What's worse than not making a decision? Second-guessing the decisions that you have already made. Not making a decision is really a decision....kind of ironic way of saying that I like things the way they are. In making a decision and then second guessing it, you are essentially saying "I don't really like things they way they are...but I'm too afraid to move forward." To me, that is an even worse torment.

Think about Lot's wife...she had her own battles with second-guessing and looking back. Genesis 19 describes how the angels came to Lot and warned him of the impending destruction of Sodom and

Gomorrah. They specifically told him not to look back at the punishment that was to come to the wicked city. It's not really clear why Lot's wife looked back. Lot, her husband, was also hesitant having to be urged by the angels to flee and not look back. Hearing all of this, she was probably asking herself "Why do we have to leave now? Surely it can't be that bad." The next thing you know she was a pillar of salt. God was trying to deliver her from a life-threatening situation...but she was still dragging her feet.

The New Testament also speaks of the issue of looking back in Luke 17:31-33, "On that day no one who is on the roof of his house, with his goods inside, should go down to get them. Likewise, no one in the field should go back for anything. Remember Lot's wife! Whoever tries to keep his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life will preserve it."

Through a recent of chain of unfortunate events, I also found myself tempted to look back at my past and wonder what I was leaving behind. Despite the fact that God had made it clear in a number of ways that it was time to move on, I still was fighting the nagging urge to move forward. I knew they weren't the best circumstances, but I still wasn't ready to move on. Just when I started to turn my focus to the past, God blessed me to be able to see more clearly his future direction for my life.

Second-guessing is not yet regret but is rooted in unresolved issues including insecurity and rejection. Perhaps most significantly, second-guessing is mixed with just enough of those painful memories of past failures to keep us from successfully transitioning to new and more wonderful seasons in our lives. Looking at my own life and some recent circumstances, I can understand how Lot's wife was tempted to look back. Her faith could only take her so far....and at that point, she just needed to be obedient.







LOCAL COLLEGE VICE PRESIDENT OF STUDENT AFFAIRS FIGHTS BREAST CANCER AND WINS

October was National Breast Cancer Awareness Month (NBCAM). Since the program began in 1985, mammography rates have more than doubled for women age 50 and older and breast cancer deaths have declined. This is exciting progress, but there are still women who do not take advantage of early detection at all and others who do not get screening mammograms and clinical breast exams at regular intervals.

Dr. Karen Buckman, the Vice President for Student Affairs at Edward Waters College, is the exception and a yearly physical with mammogram led to the early detection of breast cancer in her body and helped saved her life. "In July of 2004, I was visiting the doctor for a regular check up, when they found a mass in my breast," shared Buckman. "Through mammogram technology and a follow up exam, the doctor discovered I was in stage two of breast cancer.

"After the exam, my doctor scheduled me for surgery to remove the cancerous mass and 17 other non-cancerous lymphoids." The operations were only the beginning of the treatment. Dr. Buckman shared the battle with the doctor, who explained to the next step in treatment, chemotherapy, was going to claim all her hair.

"I told the doctor there was no-way I was going to lose my hair," she shared with a chuckle. Dr. Buckman shared after only a month of treatment her hair was completely gone. "It wasn't as bad as I thought it was going to be," she explained. "My sister Carolyn purchased several scarves for me in about every color and a few wigs, but I didn't like those well.

This medicine was difficult for her body to adjust to. "Chemo-therapy made me very sick and I was in the house a lot," exclaimed Buckman. "During this illness, the leadership (at Edwards Waters College) allowed me to work a flex schedule."

The next stage in her treatment was radiation. "After the Chemo-therapy, I received 37 treatments of radiation. My faith in God helped me through this season of my life. I held to the belief that nothing could happen to me God couldn't handle. "Although she has a history of breast cancer in her family, she believed she was totally immune from the disease attacking her body. One of the misconceptions I carried was my older sister didn't have it, so that meant it would also miss me."

According to Dr. Buckman, this experience has changed her perception about life and the various challenges she went through. One of the most profound ways it changed me is I learned to put problems in the right perspective," shared Buckman. For instance, I learned to let go of bitterness and anger from a recent divorce of over 25 years. I realize I was carrying a great deal of resentment. I am a believer your mental health is tied into your physical well being."

Dr. Buckman shares her experiences with women in her community stressing the importance of regular check ups. "Women must get their yearly check up, explained Dr. Buckman. "Even after the doctor found the lump, I still couldn't feel it, when I exam myself.

If all women age 40 and older took advantage of early detection methods – mammography plus clinical breast exam – breast cancer death rates would drop much further, up to 30 percent," says National Cancer Institute experts. "The key to mammography screening is that it be done routinely – once is not enough."

We as young black people have to be the ones to effect change. We are dying. The media has made a mockery of the Black American. Even our brothers and sisters from Africa don’t take us seriously. Something as simple as pulling up your pants and standing with your head high could make the biggest difference in the world’s perception of us. It is time to do right by ourselves. We need to love and embrace each other. No one is going to do it for us.

It all comes down to perception. What people perceive is what is reality to them. We have to change not only the media’s perception of us, but we need to change our perception of ourselves. Remember all eyes are on you Black Man. All eyes are on you Black Woman. All eyes are on you Black Child. People are waiting for us to mess up. We have let not only the media, but the government and the world taint the pure essence of us.

They have stripped our culture down to the point where we only believe we can become rappers and athletes. We are so much more. To all my black men: Its time to stand up. There are billions of Black Women who want to do nothing more than worship the ground that you walk on. We are so in love with your potential. We want to have

your back, we want to love, support and cherish every ounce of your being. But with that you have to show that you are willing to be the head of our households. You have to prove yourselves worthy of our submission. We need you to be hard working...Not a hustler. We need you to seek higher education, to seek spirituality. We need you to stand! And trust us; we will have your back. We know that it gets hard, we know you get weary. Trust and believe that there is nothing that a Black Woman and a Black Man can’t handle with GOD on their sides.

To all my Black Women: It is also time for us to stand up. It is time for

us to stop using our bodies as our primary form of communication. It is time to be that virtuous woman that Proverbs spoke of. We can not sit by the wayside while our men are dying by the masses. We are the epitome of Black Love. It starts within us. We need to speak with conviction to let not only our Black Men know, but the world knows that we are the Mothers of this world. We are so powerful. We are so beautiful. We need to love and embrace every blessing God has



given us physically, emotionally and spiritually.

For all My Black Children: We need to love them. We need to teach them. We need to stand up for them. We need to protect them. We need to show them that there are no “get rich quick” schemes. We need to tell them that they WILL die trying if they submit to a life of crime and deceit.

We need to teach our children that no one will love them the way we can. And being a basketball player, a rapper, or a drug dealer is not reality. It’s not realistic and only a small percentage of people ever make it as a rapper or professional athlete. We need to teach our children that we can be more than rappers and athletes. We can be the owners of these sports teams; we can be the CEO’s of our fortune 500 companies. We need to believe in literacy. I am almost certain if we were to look back to the 1930’s and 40’s, the literacy rates for Black American Children are probably still the same.

Ok...I am stepping off of my soap box now. Pull Up Your Pants!



Taking Matters Into Your Own Hands

Taking matters into your own hands. This has been a serious and dangerous issue for thousands of years. And it appears that we will never learn from this mistake no matter how many examples we have seen before. We must always seek the Lord first in all that we do and follow His protocol, for it is better to be blessed in a thing rather than be cursed!

If you would, please follow along with me as we glean through 1 Kings Chapter 1. We will observe one of David's sons who decided to take matters into his own hands by declaring himself king while his father David was very old and bed ridden.

1 Kings 1 (New Living Translation)

David in His Old Age

1 **Now King David was very old, and no matter how many blankets covered him, he could not keep warm.**

2 So his advisers told him, "We will find a young virgin who will wait on you and be your nurse. She will lie in your arms and keep you warm."

3 So they searched throughout the country for a beautiful girl, and they found Abishag from Shunem and brought her to the king.

4 The girl was very beautiful, and she waited on the king and took care of him. **But the king had no sexual relations with her.**

These first four verses let us know the state of King David by telling us that he was now very old, and they could not keep his body warm. David was close to death as Chapter 2 lets us know in verse 1. As the custom of that time was, they brought unto David a young nurse to take care of him. And yes she even lay beside him in his bed, but, as verse 4 states, there was no sexual relations between them. (Just in case someone's mind wandered too far).

Adonijah Claims the Throne

5 About that time David's son Adonijah, whose mother was Haggith, **decided to make himself king in place of his aged father.** So he provided himself with chariots and horses and recruited fifty men to run in front of him.

6 **Now his father, King David, had never disciplined him at any time, even by asking, "What are you doing?"** Adonijah was a very handsome man and had been born next after Absalom.

Here we get our subject. Verse 5 says that Adonijah "decided to make himself king in place of his aged father." He took matters into his own hands! One cause of Adonijah being so foolish is the fact that David was too lenient with him as stated in verse 6. Parents take note: Proverbs 13:24 says, "He who spares the rod hates his son, but he who loves him is careful to discipline him."

7 Adonijah took Joab son of Zeruiah and Abiathar the priest into his confidence, and they agreed to help him become king.

8 **But among those who remained loyal to David and refused to support Adonijah were Zadok the priest, Benaiah son of**

Jehoiada, Nathan the prophet, Shimei, Rei, and David's personal bodyguard.

9 Adonijah went to the stone of Zohelath near the spring of En-rogel, where he sacrificed sheep, oxen, and fattened calves. He invited all his brothers – the other sons of King David – and all the royal officials of Judah.

10 But he did not invite Nathan the prophet, or Benaiah, or the king's bodyguard, or his brother Solomon.

11 **Then Nathan the prophet went to Bathsheba, Solomon's mother, and asked her, "Did you realize that Haggith's son, Adonijah, has made himself king and that our lord David doesn't even know about it?"**

Nathan the true prophet of God is given a plan to correct Adonijah's foolish plan. And I find it amazing that the plan involves Bathsheba. Remember it was David's foolish plan with Bathsheba where we were first introduced to Nathan.

12 "If you want to save your own life and the life of your son Solomon, follow my counsel.

13 Go at once to King David and say to him, "My lord, didn't you promise me that my son Solomon would be the next king and would sit upon your throne? Then why has Adonijah become king?"

14 And while you are still talking with him, I will come and confirm everything you have said."

15 So Bathsheba went into the king's bedroom. He was very old now, and Abishag was taking care of him.

16 Bathsheba bowed low before him. "What can I do for you?" he asked her.

17 She replied, "My lord, you vowed to me by the LORD your God that my son Solomon would be the next king and would sit on your throne.

18 But instead, Adonijah has become the new king, and you do not even know about it.

19 He has sacrificed many oxen, fattened calves, and sheep, and he has invited all your sons and Abiathar the priest and Joab, the commander of the army. But he did not invite your servant Solomon.

20 And now, my lord the king, all Israel is waiting for your decision as to who will become king after you.

21 If you do not act, my son Solomon and I will be treated as criminals as soon as you are dead."

22 While she was still speaking with the king, Nathan the prophet arrived.

23 The king's advisers told him, "Nathan the prophet is here to see you."

Nathan went in and bowed low before the king.



HONEY

Honey is a sweet treat. In fact, it is man's oldest sweetener. It can be a good substitute for sugar in our drinks and food. The history of honey and its uses goes back to the beginning of written history. It is mentioned in the bible and in all many religious writings known to man. His autobiography, *Up from Slavery*, was a bestseller. It was translated into more than 17 different languages, and has never been out of print. He was the first Black to be commemorated on a fifty-cent coin, and the first Black to have a U.S. postage stamp named in his honor.



A God-Made Millionaire

The Story of How God Blessed Roy L. Campbell

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness and all things shall be added unto you.

Matthew 6:33

“I was unemployed with my wife and one child to feed. All alone in Oxnard, Calif. – though it seemed. This was the lowest point in my life. At the time, I didn’t realize then that I was just where God wanted me to be.”

R.L. Campbell Roofing, Inc. is a God made multi-million dollar company founded in 1994 by Roy and Debra Campbell who states that he “started roofing in 1973...been busy every since.” This company that started doing mainly residential roofing, then expanded to include commercial and government contract, now hails as one of the largest Black owned businesses in the state of Florida.

“It hasn’t always been that way,” stated Mr. Campbell remembering those earlier days in Oxnard, CA. when it seemed his world was coming apart. “I had just lost my construction job that was paying \$50,000 and had been without pay for awhile. I had a lot of time on my hands so I spent most of it in a dialogue with God. It was at that time I got serious and gave my life to Christ.”

In retrospect, I now realize that at that low time in my life, I was just where God wanted me to be...a spot where I could see Him, hear Him, and accept Him. I always wanted to own my own business, but I kept focusing on what I did not have and what I did not know.

God spoke to me and said, “Go with what you have, I will do the work.”

With a made up and committed mind, Roy Campbell went forward with no money and no equipment. The first call he made was to his father (who was retired from his own successful roofing company and living in Georgia) to inform him of his decision to start his own roofing company. His father told

At that point, Roy realized that he was trying to build his business and all he did was build deficit, when he then remembered the words of God to him... "Son, all I want you to do is manage the business, I will build it". With 80% of the business on the books completed from hurricane Erin, Roy began work on hurricane Opal, and at the end of the year-R.L. Campbell Roofing Company had done over \$3.5 million of business in 1996.

With the blessing of '95 and '96, Roy Campbell expanded into government work, an aspect of business he first learned in 1975 from his father, who at this time had returned to retirement. Then Mr. Roy Campbell signed up as an 8 A certified government contractor which led to R.L. Campbell its first mil-

He stated that it is hard finding qualified Blacks for roofing; therefore he has started his own On-The-Job training program.

Roy Campbell is from a large family consisting of 5 brothers and 5 sisters. His mother and father are deceased. He and his wife Debra now have three children; Kera, Jeremiah, and Kayla.

"Walking with the Lord is all about what He does not what I do. I am blessed because God blessed me. I did not cause those hurricanes. I did not cause the tornado to hit NAS Jax and made them call me. I know that God and only God gives the increase. When I say that I am a millionaire and not say I am a God made millionaire, it would not be true. I know it all comes from God. He is building this business...His business. He just chose me to manage it."

"When God blessed me with these finances, I prayed to God and asked him to give me wisdom with these finances. He said to find out where I'm doing a work and give support. 24 He asked, "My lord, have you decided that Adonijah will be the next king and that he will sit on your throne?"

25 Today he has sacrificed many oxen, fattened calves, and sheep, and he has invited your sons to attend the celebration. He also invited Joab, the commander of the army, and Abiathar the priest. They are feasting and drinking with him and shouting, 'Long live King Adonijah!'

26 But I myself, your servant, was not invited; neither were Zadok the priest, Benaiah son of Jehoiada, nor Solomon.

27 Has my lord really done this without letting any of his servants know who should be the next king?"

Nathan's plan worked as he said and now David would set the matter straight.

David Makes Solomon King

28 "Call Bathsheba," David said. So she came back in and stood before the king.

29 And the king vowed, "As surely as the LORD lives, who has rescued me from every danger,

30 today I decree that your son Solomon will be the next king and will sit on my throne, just as I swore to you before the LORD, the God of Israel."

31 Then Bathsheba bowed low before him again and exclaimed, "May my lord King David live forever!"

32 Then King David ordered, "Call Zadok the priest, Nathan the prophet, and Benaiah son of Jehoiada." When they came into the King's presence,

33 the king said to them, "Take Solomon and my officers down to Gihon Spring. Solomon is to ride on my personal mule.

34 There Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet are to anoint him king over Israel. Then blow the trumpets and shout, 'Long live King Solomon!'

35 When you bring him back here, he will sit on my throne. He will succeed me as king, for I have appointed him to be ruler over Israel and Judah."

36 "Amen!" Benaiah son of Jehoiada replied. "May the LORD, the God of my lord the king, decree it to be so.

37 And may the LORD be with Solomon as he has been with you, and may he make Solomon's reign even greater than yours!"

38 So Zadok the priest, Nathan the prophet, Benaiah son of Jehoiada, and the king's bodyguard took Solomon down to Gihon Spring, and Solomon rode on King David's personal mule.

39 There Zadok the priest took a flask of olive oil from the sacred tent and poured it on Solomon's head. Then the trumpets were blown, and all the people shouted, "Long live King Solomon!"

40 And all the people returned with Solomon to Jerusalem, playing flutes and shouting for joy. The celebration was so joyous and noisy that the earth shook with the sound.

41 Adonijah and his guests heard the celebrating and shouting just as they were finishing their banquet. When Joab heard the sound of trumpets, he asked, "What's going on? Why is the city in such an uproar?"

42 And while he was still speaking, Jonathan son of Abiathar the priest arrived. "Come in," Adonijah said to him, "for you are a good man. You must have good news."

43 "Not at all!" Jonathan replied. "Our lord King David has just declared Solomon king!"

44 The king sent him down to Gihon Spring with Zadok the priest, Nathan the prophet, and Benaiah son of Jehoiada, protected by the king's bodyguard. They had him ride on the king's own mule,

45 and Zadok and Nathan have anointed him as the new king. They have just returned, and the whole city is celebrating and rejoicing. That's what all the noise is about.



KRAMER GOT CALLED OUT FOR N-WORD DIATRIBE, SO SHOULD BLACKS THAT USE IT

Former Seinfeld star Michael “Kramer” Richards quickly bowed to public pressure and apologized for his boneheaded N-word laced diatribe against black customers who allegedly heckled him during his appearance at the Laugh Factory. But Richards was a soft target. He’s a white man that sprinted way over the line of racial etiquette. It was a no brainer that blacks would rage against him. They have done the same against the legion of other white celebrities, politicians and public figures that have gotten caught with their racial pants hanging down.

When the predictable firestorm hits, they back peddle fast, do their mea culpas and declare they’re not racist.

The same can’t be said for the legion of black comedians and rappers that have virtually canonized the word. They sprinkle the word throughout their rap lyrics and comedy lines, and black writers, and filmmakers go through lengthy gyrations to justify using the word. During a panel discussion at the Summer Television Critics Association tour in 2005, Aaron McGruder, creator of the popular comic strip, Boondocks, defiantly told the audience that he’d use the N-word as much as he pleased in his comic strip and in his series on the Cartoon Network’s Adult Swim. If folks didn’t like it, well tough.

McGruder and N-word users and apologists serve up the lame rationale that the more a black person uses the word, the less offensive it becomes. They claim that they are cleansing the word of its negative connotations so that racists can no longer use it to hurt blacks. Comedian, turned activist, Dick Gregory had the same idea some years ago when he titled his autobiography, *Nigger*. Black writer, Robert DeCoy also tried to apply the same racial shock therapy to whites when he titled his novel, *The Nigger Bible*.

The black N-word apologists tick off an endless storehouse of defenses to justify use of the word. They claim that that it is a term of endearingly or affectionately. They say to each other, “You’re my nigger if you don’t get no bigger.” Or, “that nigger sure is something.” Others use it in anger or disdain, “Nigger you sure got an attitude.” Or, “A nigger ain’t s...” Still, others are defiant. They say they don’t care what a white person calls them since words can’t harm them.

They forget, ignore or distort one thing. Words are not value neutral. They express concepts and ideas. Often, words reflect society’s standards. If color-phobia is a deep-rooted standard in American life, then a word, as emotionally charged as nigger, will always reinforce and perpetuate stereotypes. It can’t be sanitized, cleansed, inverted, or redeemed as a culturally liberating word. Nigger can’t and shouldn’t be made acceptable, no matter whose mouth it comes out of or what excuse is tossed out for using it.

There are still dozens of daily examples where whites (and other non-blacks) taunt, and harass blacks by calling them nigger, spray paint the word on their homes, businesses, churches, physically assault and even murder blacks. In the FBI’s annual count of hate crimes in America, blacks still make up the overwhelming majority of victims.

The N-word reigns supreme at the top of the stack as the favorite racial epithet hurled at blacks during these crimes. Even when the word isn’t used, the sentiment is that blacks are still fair game too be abused and dehumanized, and the N word reinforces that belief. The word nigger is and will always have, grotesque, and deadly meaning to them. And, even if some blacks do occasionally go off the deep end and wrongly harangue whites for using the word, maybe that’s because nigger, pricks agonizing historical and social sores.

In all fairness, a handful of black activists have waged war against the N word. There’s a website that hawks T shirts, DVDs and exhorts blacks, especially young blacks, to solemnly pledge not to use the word or patronize anyone who puts out products that use the word. Presumably that’s aimed at those rappers and writers that have turned the N word into a lucrative growth industry.

But they have been the exception. Blacks have been more than willing to give other blacks that use the word a pass. The indulgence sends the subtle signal that the word is hardly the earth-shattering, illegitimate word that black and white N word opponents brand it.

Richards gave no public hint before his profane outburst that he was a closet bigot who routinely used the word in reference to blacks. But he didn’t have too. The obsessive use of and the tortured defense of the word by so many blacks gave Richards the license to use the word without any thought that there’d be any blow back for doing it. He was terribly wrong and got publicly called out for it. The blacks that use and defend that word should be called out too.

Who’s willing to do that?

“ARE WE AFRAID TO BELIEVE THAT GOD SENT US THE HOLY GHOST?”

The Shame of the Nation:

The Restoration of Apartheid Schooling in America

Public school resegregation is a “national horror hidden in plain view,” writes former educator turned public education activist Kozol (*Savage Inequalities*, *Amazing Grace*). Kozol visited 60 schools in 11 states over a five-year period and finds, despite the promise of *Brown v. Board of Education*, many schools serving black and Hispanic children are spiraling backward to the pre-*Brown* era.



These schools lack the basics: clean classrooms, hallways and restrooms; up-to-date books in good condition; and appropriate laboratory supplies. Teachers and administrators eschew creative coursework for rote learning to meet testing and accountability mandates, thereby “embracing a pedagogy of direct command and absolute control” usually found in “penal institutions and drug rehabilitation programs.”

As always, Kozol presents sharp and poignant portraits of the indignities vulnerable individuals endure. “You have all the things and we do not have all the things,” one eight-year-old Bronx boy wrote the author. In another revealing exchange, a cynical high school student tells his classmate, a young woman with college ambitions who was forced into hair braiding and sewing classes, “You’re ghetto-so you sew.”

Kozol discovers widespread acceptance for the notion that “schools in ghettoized communities must settle for a different set of academic and career goals” than schools serving middle-and upper-class children. Kozol tempers this gloom with hopeful interactions between energetic teachers and receptive children in schools where all is not lost. But these “treasured places” don’t hide the fact, Kozol argues, that school segregation is still the rule for poor minorities, or that Kozol, and the like-minded politicians, educators and advocates he seeks out, believe a new civil rights movement will be necessary to eradicate it.

Most holiday proposals encounter strong opposition, particularly today. Moreover, just about every constituency has some day it would like to commemorate. Feminists have long fought for a Susan B. Anthony Day on the suffragist’s birthday Feb. 15. The Irish would prefer to have St. Patrick’s Day off, the Finns St. Urho’s Day (March 16). Tree lovers and environmentalists can make a case for Arbor Day to be an official holiday. Commercial interests push Valentine’s Day.

While legislation supporting these holidays has never gotten beyond the lip-service stage, special interests have created a number of holidays not universally observed. Longshoremen, for instance, take off Harry Bridges’ birthday to honor the popular labor leader. In the south, Robert E. Lee’s birthday has long been observed by various states on the third Monday of January. This creates an interesting historical contradiction for those that, like Virginia that added the observance of King’s birthday to that date as well.

Not specifically patriotic or religious, the King Holiday does not fit any traditional category. But black leaders hope it will become a deeply spiritual day. “I think it should be devoted to some activity which expresses love of our fellow person, or spiritual recognition of some kind,” says Dr. Donald G. Phelps, chancellor of Seattle Community College District, which for 12 years before the national holiday, conducted a widely attended memorial service in King’s honor on his birthday. “As we’ve celebrated it in the past, it’s become a day where more people come together in an ecumenical way — go to other churches, worship together the way we don’t on Sunday — than any other. It’s a day when we can honor Dr. King’s principles, which are really American principles in their truest form. “It shouldn’t be a holiday where we all go fishing.”

In the last few years the focus of our country has been on terrorism. It has affected the way we live, travel, do business, think, feel and sleep. Adjustments have been made in all facets of life especially the economy and the deployment of our military. Much needed socio-economical programs have been eliminated, cuts in the government's support of tuition programs has prohibited many student from attending college, and over 3,000 of our young people have died and over 8,000 have been seriously wounded in Iraq as we gauge this War Against Terrorism.

Terrorism is not a person, place or thing. It is not rooted in any place or a certain region. Terrorism is a concept. It can be adopted by anyone and carried any place. 


Gerard Placide warms up the mike!



